Do golfers really need to hit down on the ball to make the ball go up? For many years, golfers were told to hit down on the golf ball to hit the ball better. While you do want to hit the ball on a descending blow with an iron, I feel this concept does more harm than good. "Hitting down" has little to do with the initial launch of the ball. The dynamic loft of the club is what's important when striking the ball. When you tell a golfer to hit down, they will most likely steepen the club and force their hands down into the golf ball. However, when the best players in the world hit a golf ball, their hands at impact are moving up while the club is descending. Just be mindful the next time someone tells you to hit down on the ball, it may not be what you need to hear.

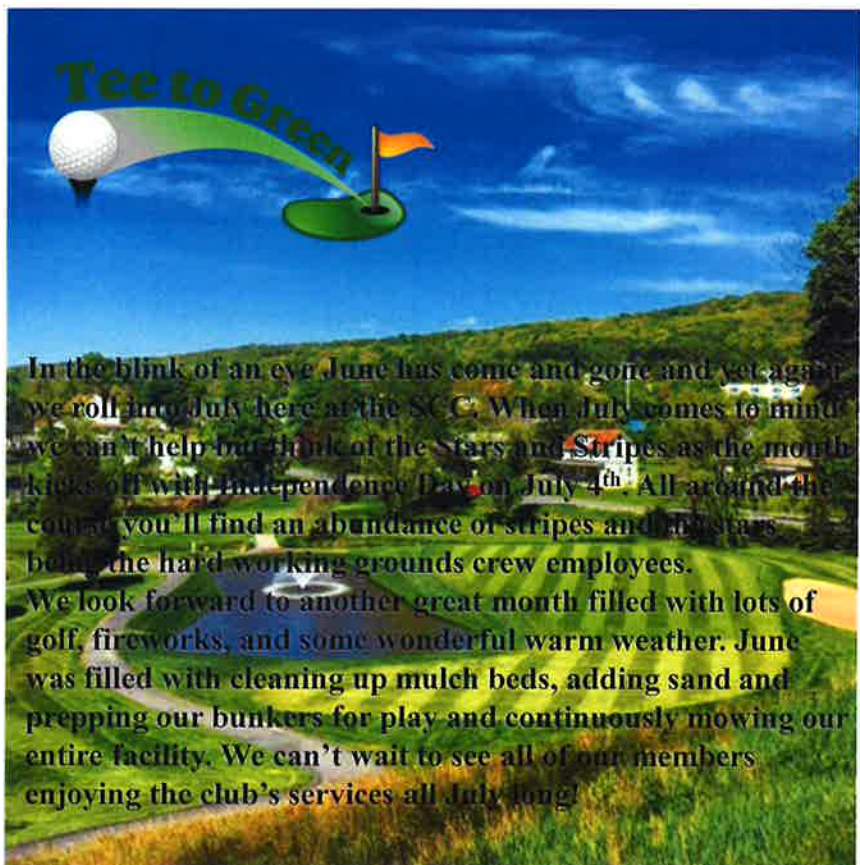

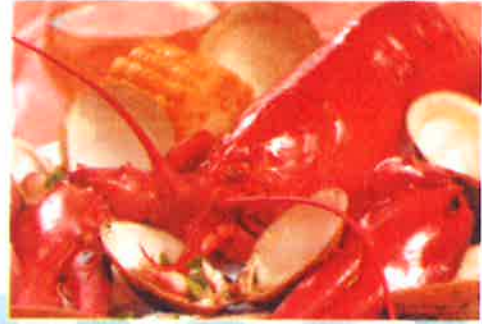
